

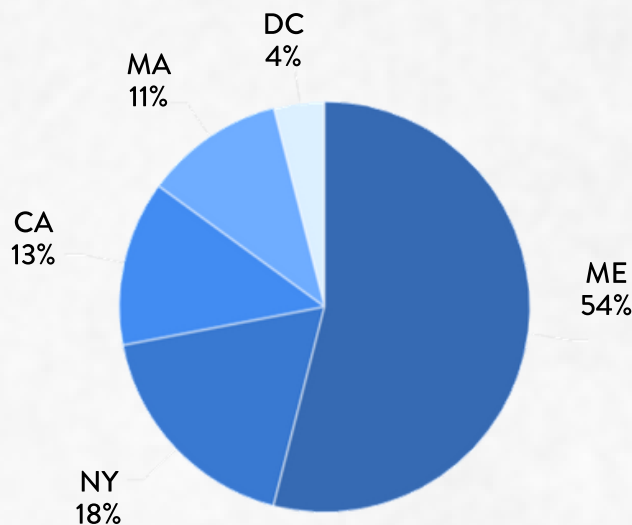


Money in Maine Politics Fact Sheet

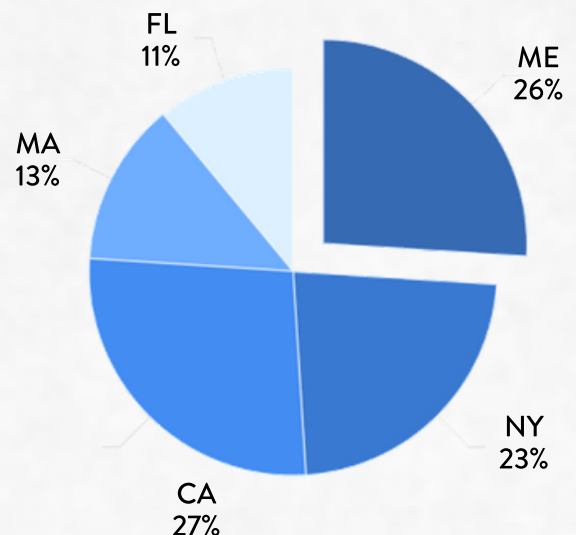
Maine faces the most expensive election in our history, with outside interests outspending Mainers 12-to-1. To protect the right of Maine voters to make our own decisions for our state and our way of life, we must stand together to end the flood of money drowning out our voices in our own elections.

Maine has been a leader in the national movement for the next amendment to the U.S. Constitution to ensure political representation for all Americans, not only elite special interests. Now is the time for Mainers to use our votes to ensure whoever we elect stands with us, not outside interests, to advance this critical reform across the finish line.

TOP 5 SOURCES OF MAINE CAMPAIGN MONEY (2008)

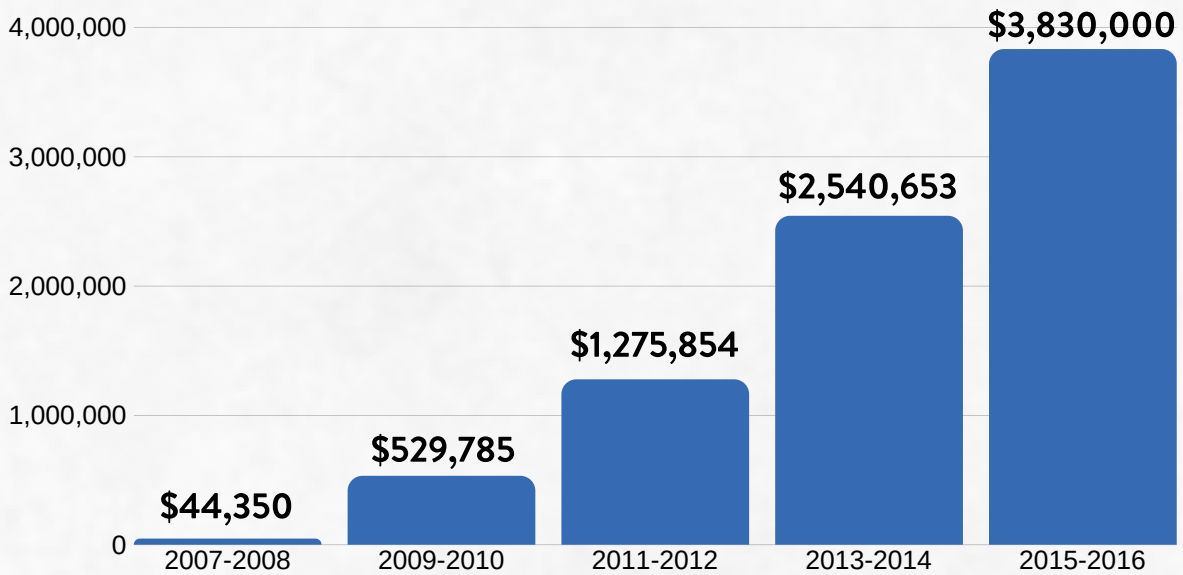


TOP 5 SOURCES OF MAINE CAMPAIGN MONEY (2020)
