

Lawmakers stepped up to end unlimited political spending.


On the 11th anniversary of the *Citizens United*Supreme Court decision, a bipartisan group of elected officials led by **Representatives Ted**Deutch (D-FL), John Katko (R-NY), Jamie Raskin (D-MD), and Jim McGovern (D-MA) introduced a constitutional amendment to end unlimited political spending by overturning the ruling. Sen. Shaheen (D-NH) followed with a Senate introduction.

Virginia Becomes the 22nd State to Call for Our Amendment

Affirming that our state-based, citizen-driven empowerment model works, <u>Virginia joined 21 other states</u> to back our For Our Freedom amendment when lawmakers passed legislation supporting efforts to amend the U.S. Constitution.

Maine's \$200 Million Senate Race

Following Maine's \$200 million election in 2020, we looked into the source of the money. The eye-opening findings of our resulting report underscore the massive amount of money eroding our political system. *Under the Avalanche* tells the story of money's influence on our leaders – a cycle of spending our amendment will end for good.



647 donations

over \$100,000 were made to the Super PACs operating in Maine. **Not one** such gift came from in state.



Over 98%

of **ad spending** by Super PACs, the Senate Majority PAC and the Senate Leadership Fund, **was negative**.

On a single cold day in November, American Promise and Protect Maine Elections Joined Forces to mobilize hundreds of volunteers across Maine to talk with their neighbors, gathering 30,000 signatures in support of ending foreign influence on our elections.



Scaling Our State-Based Model

Taking lessons learned from Phase One of our work, we continued connecting with our communities safely. Through both in-person and virtual gatherings, we

welcomed many new citizens to our American Promise team.

A Virtual World Did Not Stop NJ Leaders

New Jersey American Promise members connected virtually with **Congressman Andy Kim (D-NJ)**, hosting a town meeting and mobilizing the Congressman to publish an opinion piece in the media.





National Advocacy Team Calls

Our talented and passionate volunteer leaders spent the last few years on the ground, learning grassroots skills and sharing them with other citizens in their communities. To help grow our movement nationwide, these leaders launched monthly calls to share actionoriented tips, such as letter to the editor trainings, friend bankings, and meetings with elected officials.

American Promise Connect

We introduced a quarterly call to create space for citizens from all corners of the United States to learn more about our amendment. These calls highlight key themes and strategies in our efforts. For example, our final AP Connect Call of 2021 featured guest speakers John F. Kowal and Wilfred U. Codrington III discussing their book "The People's Constitution: 200 Years, 27 Amendments, and the Promise of a More Perfect Union."

As always in our state and Congress work, we partner with **dozens of organizations and people** to continue building a broad coalition of citizens. Many of our partners made guest appearances or co-sponsored our AP Connect calls in 2021.

For Our Freedom Constitution Day Launch

We celebrated Constitution Day at Independence Hall in Pennsylvania where we heard from keynote speakers **Professor Craig Green** of Temple University; **Kyle Darby**, CEO of the Philadelphia-based Darby Public Strategies; **John Pudner**, the Executive Director of Take Back Our Republic; and many more as we launched our efforts to make Pennsylvania the 23rd state to call for a constitutional amendment in 2022. **Cross-partisan former Governors**, **legislators**, **faith and community leaders have endorsed the <u>Pennsylvania For Our Freedom campaign</u>.**

National Farmers Union

- In May 2021, we hosted our 4th annual National Citizen Leadership Conference virtually. Speakers (pictured from left to right) included Advisory Council member and former Massachusetts Governor Deval Patrick; constitutional amendment leaders from across the political spectrum, including U.S. Representatives Jamie Raskin, John Katko, Ted Deutch and Jim McGovern: Former FEC Commissioner Ann Ravel: Our Common Purpose Commission Co-Chairs Danielle Allen and Eric Liu, joined by Commissioner Pete Peterson; a new generation of leaders, including Bridge USA CEO and American Promise Education Fund Board Member Manu Meel, Issue Voter founder Maria Yuan, R Street Fellow Anthony Marcum, and Millennial Action Project CEO Layla Zaidane; national security and democracy experts such as US Army Colonel Lawrence Wilkerson, Nilmini Rubin, and Protect Democracy's Rachel Goodman; as well as business, faith and other leaders.
- Our in-person and online events, civic trainings and educational trainings engaged with, educated, and secured support from thousands of Americans, bringing together citizen leaders and dozens of reform organizations from all 50 states, providing peer-to-peer networking and training, and concluding with a highly organized and effective citizen lobby day in Congress.
- We expanded our leadership and convening capacity, bringing together and strategically aligning and collaborating with other organizations helping to move our constitutional amendment in Congress.

Business Leaders United Towards a Better Future

Our American Promise National

Business Network — a well-connected network of civically responsible business professionals and a key group to winning our amendment — grew.

- Maine's <u>Stand With Maine</u> chapter welcomed over <u>130 new members</u> from Maine's business community, amplifying their united sentiment that big-money groups should not drown out the voices of small and mid-sized businesses.
- We launched our efforts in Pennsylvania, earning the support of **Alan Jennings**, former executive director of the Community Action Committee of Lehigh Valley and Program Host of WDIY 88.1 Radio, as well as **David Black**, former CEO/President of the Harrisburg Chamber of Commerce (retired) who is working with the 180 Chambers across the state for support.
- Following the insurrection at the Capitol last January, Paul Polman, Co-Founder and chair of IMAGINE, the chair of The B Team, and the former CEO of Unilever urged businesses to rethink their relationships with politics in the name of democratic preservation. Arguing that "Citizens United reinforced the notion that America's democracy serves the interests of those who can afford to buy political authority," he called for a constitutional amendment to end the Supreme Court ruling's dominance on our political system.

 latest development in a long relationship with Rotary


