Letter from Jeff Clements, CEO

Dear Friends,

As we reflect on the remarkable progress and achievements of American Promise in 2023, it is evident that we have reached a pivotal moment in our journey to pass the For Our Freedom Amendment and secure a government that truly represents “We The People.” This past year has demonstrated that we are at a tipping point – a critical juncture where our sustained efforts are yielding significant breakthroughs and accelerating momentum towards our goal.

The concept of the “tipping point” is central to understanding the dynamics of social change and the success of our strategy. In complex systems, like our political landscape, change often follows a nonlinear path. Small actions and incremental progress can accumulate over time, building pressure until a critical threshold is reached, and the system rapidly shifts into a new state. This is the essence of the tipping point – the moment when the balance of forces tips in favor of transformative change.

At American Promise, we have been diligently working to create the conditions for a tipping point where Americans can come together, unified in our resolve to fix our broken and corrupt pay-to-play political system. Our strategy is grounded in the principles of complex systems theory, recognizing that lasting change requires sustained, multi-faceted efforts that engage Americans from all walks of life and across the political spectrum.

In 2023, the signs of a tipping point were unmistakable. National polling confirmed that more than 75% of Americans, regardless of political affiliation, support the For Our Freedom Amendment. Our ballot initiatives and resolutions continued to win overwhelming voter approval, with Maine’s Yes on Question 2 initiative achieving a record-breaking 86% victory. The media took notice of American Promise, with outlets from Politico to NBC News covering our progress and the growing demand for change.

These developments signal that we are reaching a critical mass of public awareness, grassroots engagement, and political will. The foundation we have laid over the past seven years is now yielding exponential returns, as more Americans awaken to the urgent need for constitutional reform to stop the toxic influence of money in our elections and campaigns.

As we move forward into 2024 and beyond, we stand poised to capitalize on this tipping point moment. With 22 states already backing the For Our Freedom Amendment and momentum building in Congress, we have a historic opportunity to accelerate our progress and secure the 28th Amendment to the Constitution.

But we cannot do it alone. As always, our success depends on the support and dedication of our

Our Organizational Growth in 2023

Throughout 2023, American Promise experienced significant growth in capacity, thanks to the support of our investors and leadership within our ranks. We have been able to take major strides forward in our plan to pass and ratify the For Our Freedom Amendment.

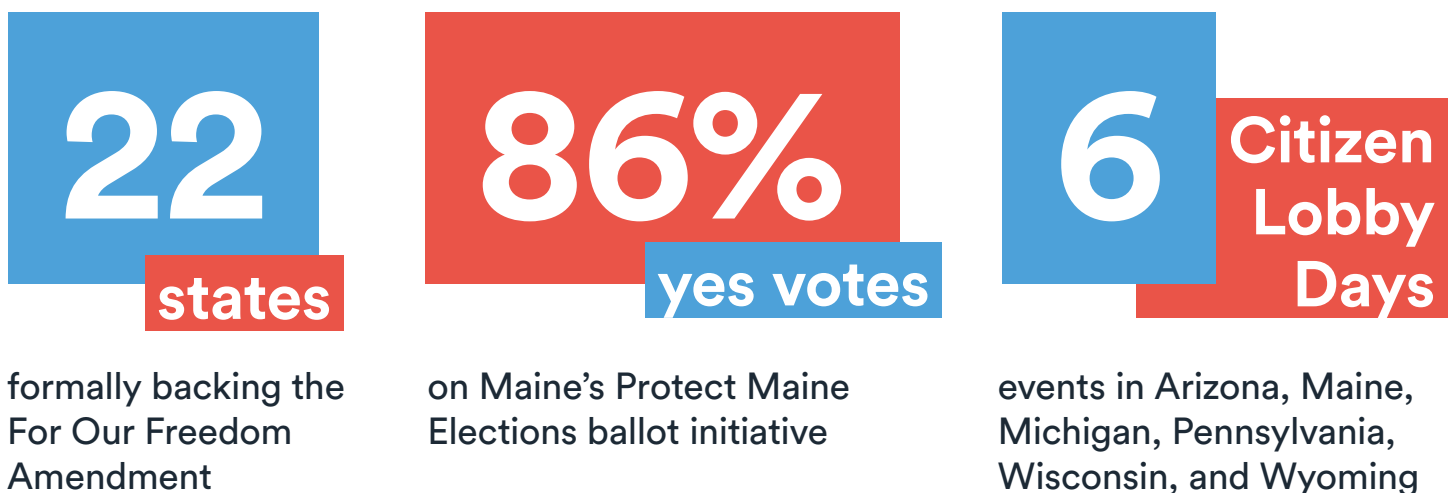
American Promise is on an exciting journey, growing quickly from a start-up nonprofit with a big idea into a strategic, well-resourced operation with the top-notch talent and dedication necessary to achieve our bold objectives.

In 2023, we began to build out an expanded leadership management team to join our CEO in executing the multi-state, Congressional, and communications strategies to win the necessary vote in Congress and ratification in three-quarters of the states. We now have executives in place to expertly lead our programs, operations and development functions at the organization, and to manage the continued growth that is ahead of us.

This team has set in motion the most sophisticated organizational and political strategic plan in our history, one that we believe will allow us to succeed in both Congress and the states. Key details of our 50-state plan for success can be found on our updated website, which launched in October 2023.

To date, 22 states have affirmed their support for the For Our Freedom Amendment. This achievement

has been challenging, and we recognize that securing the next set of states will be equally, if not more, demanding. To prepare for success in these additional states, we have established a state-based structure where we anticipate achieving success in 2024 and beyond.

In 2023, we initiated the growth that has continued in 2024 that ensures that staff are in place to serve the urgent demand of Americans for real reform and successfully execute multiple state “ready-to-ratify” campaigns at once, maintain a constant presence and pressure in Congress, and build out our communications and network approach to reaching Americans around the nation. We brought on twelve new staff members in 2023 to meet that need.

In addition, American Promise began expanding our Boards and National Advisory Council. Leila Blodgett and Christian Nolen joined the boards of American Promise and American Promise Education Fund, serving on the Development Committee and the Governance Committee. In addition, Aliya Bhatia, the dynamic Executive Director of Vot-ER and Civic Health Month and Suzanne Brennan Firstenberg, the acclaimed Social Practice Visual Artist who brought the COVID memorial to the National Mall, joined our Advisory Council.

These strategic hires and additions to our leadership are the beginning of an expansion program that has continued in 2024. In our early years, we proved the need for our constitutional reform and demonstrated that we know how to get it done. In 2023, we raised the capital to put these new positions in place and validated our strategic plan.

Now American Promise is positioned to effectively scale our efforts, expand our reach, and drive the necessary progress towards ratifying the For Our Freedom Amendment. With a growing team of extraordinary talent and dedication, we are well-equipped to tackle the challenges ahead and capitalize on the opportunities for success in the coming years.





AMPLIFYING OUR MESSAGE

Communications Breakthroughs

We recognize the importance of an effective and consistent communications strategy. In 2023, we expanded our communications infrastructure and capacity, amplified our message and engaged a broader audience.

This strategic expansion enabled us to launch a fully redesigned website, refresh our brand identity, and capture the attention of attendees at the American Democracy Summit with our For Our Freedom Amendment branding takeover.

We successfully rolled out new social media platforms, and made substantial investments in data-driven communications technology, allowing us to better understand our audience, tailor our messaging, and measure the impact of our outreach efforts.

These advancements have positioned American Promise to effectively communicate our vision, mobilize support, and drive the change needed to achieve our ambitious goals in the coming years.

To enhance our capabilities to reach more external media, we engaged CLYDE, an external public affairs and communications firm with experience in cross-partisan work and a proven ability to help organizations leverage their successes to gain greater exposure in earned media.

The organization conducted a messaging audit, workshops, feedback sessions, and surveys with internal and external core audiences to collect both quantitative and qualitative data.

The culmination of this effort was the creation of a messaging playbook, which ensures consistency and message discipline across all of our communications as we enter our next stage of growth.

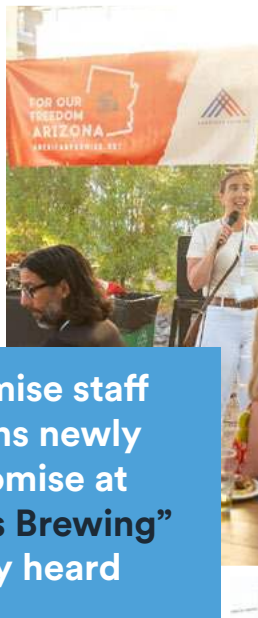


Once the amendment passes in Congress, it is sent to the States for ratification. We are following the path of every successful amendment and investing in state based infrastructure to drive progress in Congress and prepare for the ultimate ratification in the states.

22 states have called on Congress to propose the amendment so far.

4 American Promise priority states include: Arizona, Maine, Pennsylvania, and Wisconsin.

The success of our campaign does not depend on Washington lobbyists—it depends on citizen unity and action: We the People, speaking up and taking action where we live.



Arizona

In May 2023, American Promise staff joined more than fifty citizens newly engaging with American Promise at our first “Arizona Freedom is Brewing” event in Phoenix, where they heard from:

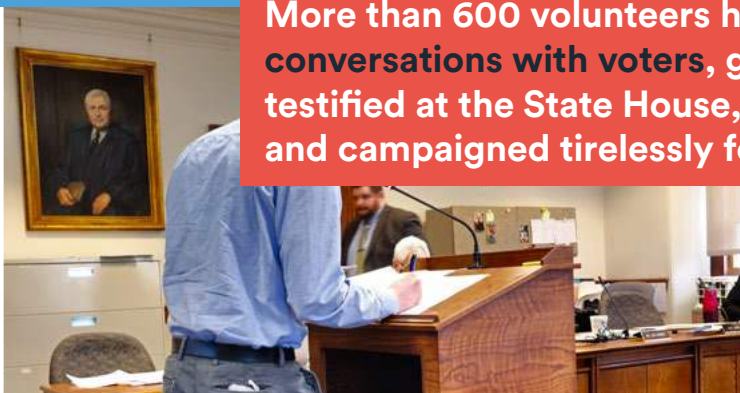
Maine

In early May, Protect Maine Elections and American Promise volunteers congregated at the Maine State House to rally and testify in support of LD 1610, the bill Protect Maine Elections had been working on to increase transparency in and regulation of election spending. Republican and Democratic legislators from around the state joined voters and American Promise staff to testify in support. Testimony lasted for 2.5 hours, with nearly everyone who testified doing so in support of the bill.

On November 7, Maine voters made history, voting overwhelmingly in favor of the Protect Maine Elections/ Yes on Question 2 initiative, with a resounding 86% victory.

This marks the widest margin of victory on a statewide ballot measure in Maine's history. The new law would shut down foreign government spending in Maine's elections and empower the State Ethics Commission to ensure that members of Maine's Congressional delegation actively advance cross-partisan support for the For Our Freedom Amendment in Congress.

More than 600 volunteers had nearly 100,000 conversations with voters, gathered signatures, testified at the State House, conducted phone banking, and campaigned tirelessly for this resounding win.



Pennsylvania



American Promise made big gains in Pennsylvania advancing a cross-partisan resolution in the legislature calling on Congress to pass the For Our Freedom Amendment. The introduction of the measure follows American Promise's grassroots and business network advocacy, an endorsement from the highly-respected Committee of 70, and is backed by Republican sponsors in the Senate and Democratic sponsors in the House.


Adding to the momentum, we hired Matt Powell as our Pennsylvania State Manager. Matt joins us from the Lehigh Valley Chamber of Commerce and previously served as Senior Legislative Assistant with Congressman Tom Marino in Washington.





Wisconsin

In Wisconsin, a cross-partisan, hardworking team of American Promise Wisconsin volunteers organized two days of meetings with dozens of legislators – both Democrats and Republicans – in Madison. These meetings resulted in numerous productive conversations, with many legislators voicing support and moving us ever-closer to getting Wisconsin “ready to ratify.”



We have also met with several prominent Wisconsin business leaders, as well as college organizations at Marquette University in Milwaukee. These meetings help to strengthen our business and Young Americans networks in Wisconsin, enabling us to empower citizen leaders across key communities.

Progress at the Federal Level

Winning a constitutional amendment requires a strategic approach that focuses on both state and federal levels. American Promise understands this critical path to success. While most of our work is concentrated in the states, we also need a two-thirds majority vote in Congress and ratification by three-fourths of the states to ultimately prevail.

We track our progress on both fronts: 22 states have already expressed their support for the For Our Freedom Amendment, and in Congress, more than 140 House members and 41 Senators are co-sponsors of the leading Democratic proposal for the amendment.

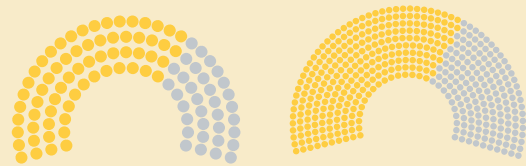
With Republican House veteran Jim Dornan now serving as our Congressional Affairs Director based in Washington, D.C., and strong Republican support in our state campaigns, we are in active conversations that we believe will convert to strong support for a Republican proposal for the amendment in 2024-25, and a successful vote to follow debate about the different proposals.

A powerful endorsement of the For Our Freedom Amendment came from Republican State Senator Rick Bennett (ME) and former Republican State Senator Jim Rubens (NH), who provided compelling written testimony before Congress. As self-proclaimed “constitutional originalists,” their support highlights the amendment’s cross-partisan appeal and its alignment with the Founders’ vision of representative self-government. The continued backing from conservative leaders like Rubens and Bennett effectively challenges the misconception that campaign finance reform is a partisan issue, helping to build a broad-based coalition in favor of change.

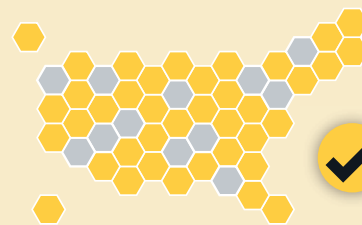
In addition, Senator Josh Hawley (R-MO) introduced the “Ending Corporate Influence on Elections Act of 2023,” yet another demonstration of the need for solutions to tackle the concentrated power of global corporations and out-of-control money in our elections. Senator Hawley’s bill proposed

Achieving this amendment requires:

- 1 Proposal by 2/3 of both the Senate and the House



- 2 Ratification by 3/4 of the state legislatures



prohibiting publicly traded corporations from using Super PACs and so-called “independent spending” to influence elections.

“As Senator Hawley recognized, the Supreme Court’s decisions on corporations and money in politics cannot be squared with the Constitution as originally understood by the Framers or by Americans ever since,” said Brian Boyle, American Promise’s Chief Programs Officer & General Counsel. “It will take an amendment to the U.S. Constitution to permanently fix the disaster unleashed by the Supreme Court’s decision in Citizens United and other campaign finance cases.”

“Based on our experience as citizens, business owners, and state legislators, we strongly support the amendment being championed by American Promise – the For Our Freedom Amendment – as the best constitutional solution to repair the yawning trust deficit between the American people and their elected officials.

Conservative Political Action Conference (CPAC)

In 2023, American Promise staff members and Board member Jim Rubens attended the Conservative Political Action Conference in Washington, D.C. The multi-day event was attended by both conservative activists and elected officials.

Our team engaged in many positive conversations with conservative Americans who were either already enthusiastic supporters of our amendment or deeply concerned about the growing influence of money in elections.



Research and Polling

We recognize the urgent national need to address the influence of money in campaigns and the importance of the For Our Freedom Amendment, and the American public continues to seek proof that public sentiment aligns with our cause.

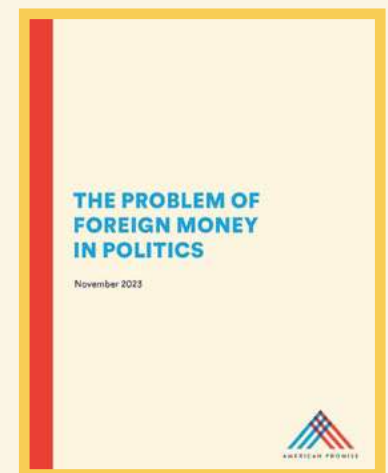


The launch of the Research + Polling page on our website has provided a valuable resource for educating the public about the growing influence of money in politics and the overwhelming support for change. The page features our original research reports, such as the “UnCommon Wealth 2.0” report on campaign spending in Pennsylvania and “The Problem of Foreign Money in Politics” report, which highlights how foreign interests are spending massive amounts to influence U.S. elections.

By making this research accessible to the public, American Promise has helped increase understanding of the complex issues surrounding campaign finance and build support for reform. As more people become aware of the extent of the problem and the viable solutions we offer, our organization moves closer to achieving widespread recognition of our mission.

Mobilizing The Legal Community



American Promise was invited to participate in an academic symposium organized by the Brennan Center entitled “Constitutional Amendments: Time to Rethink?” Our CEO Jeff Clements took the stage with leading scholars, marking a new level of inclusion and indicating that our work to pass a constitutional amendment across the country is being taken seriously.

Our participation in this event demonstrated once again that hearing true stories about Americans working together across political divides can challenge the narrative that we are “too divided” to make significant change. Scholars are recognizing that we’re in a constitutional moment in America, and sought out American Promise to provide our perspective on the path forward for change.

We are at a tipping point where legal scholars, who have traditionally been skeptical about the chances of amending the Constitution, are beginning to realize that it is time to get behind American Promise’s constitutional solution.

Other Briefs:

As a further demonstration of American Promise’s footing in the broader legal community, we submitted a working paper to the American Bar Association Task Force on Democracy, highlighting the need for a constitutional amendment to address the structural factors undermining Americans’ confidence and participation in self-government, entitled “A Constitutional Amendment to Address the Corrosive Influence of Money in the American Political System.”

Leadership at the American Democracy Summit

In September 2023, we co-hosted 1,000 attendees at the American Democracy Summit in Los Angeles with America's leading non-partisan reform organizations. We held a pre-conference Leadership Dinner to bring together our investors, thought leaders and partners, and hear from leadership what's next for American Promise and the country.

Bringing Americans together across geographic, political, and demographic differences is core to American Promise's mission and our strategy to win. Our acclaimed National Citizen Leadership Conference does this each year in Washington, D.C., and we do it regularly in American communities with our Freedom is Brewing events around the country.

American Promise staff and volunteer leaders were featured on four panels that unpacked the crisis of corruption and the For Our Freedom constitutional solution:

- One Size Does Not Fit All: Leveraging Federalism For Freedom
- The Constitution Still Belongs to Us: A New Amendment Era is Here
- The For Our Freedom Amendment: In the States and Across America
- Amending the Constitution: An Inside Look at our Strategy, Tactics and Methods

American Promise Speaker Series

In May 2023, *New York Times* internationally bestselling author, script and screenplay writer, and political activist Gregg Hurwitz joined our Leadership Speaker Series. This forum highlights the thoughts and ideas of innovators driving forward the For Our Freedom Amendment and positive change for all Americans. In his talk, “Writing the Next Chapter: How We Secure a Better Future for All,” Hurwitz discussed writing, effectively communicating in politics, and bridging seemingly insurmountable hyper-partisan divides. In October, we spoke with author and award-winning social entrepreneur Shalyn Romney Garrett, co-author of “The Upswing: How America Came Together a Century Ago and How We Can Do It Again.” Romney Garrett discussed how, a century ago, Americans responded to a wave of corruption, injustice, war, pandemic, and political division and violence by ratifying four constitutional amendments, passing lasting structural reform, and rebuilding the moral and spiritual foundation of the country. She demonstrated how American Promise’s approach can help Americans achieve similar progress today.

In December, we had another great conversation in our 2023 Speaker Series, featuring Trevor Potter, President of Campaign Legal Center, counsel to the late Senator John McCain, former Chairman of the Federal Election Commission, and a member of the American Promise Advisory Council and leadership community.



David Nevins Bridging Fund and Fellowship

In 2023, American Promise was thrilled to launch the David Nevins Bridging Fund and Fellowship, made possible by the generous support of Bridge Alliance co-founder David Nevins. These initiatives will strengthen American Promise's partnerships with Bridge USA, Bridge Alliance, and other nonpartisan/cross-partisan organizations and networks, enabling us to more effectively achieve our mission and engage more young Americans in our impactful work of civic healing and constitutional change.

The David Nevins Fellowship provided funding for a one-year position for a recent college graduate to join the American Promise staff as the Young Americans Network Coordinator. This role is responsible for managing the recruitment, promotion, and support for young Americans participating in the National Citizen Leadership Conference and Citizen Lobby Day, as well as expanding our national network of young Americans engaged in American Promise's work across the country.

We were proud to utilize this fellowship to hire Grace Hall as our Young Americans Network Coordinator. Based in Atlanta, Georgia, Grace is a native of the state and a graduate of the University of Georgia.

The David Nevins Bridging Fund and Fellowship have been instrumental in expanding our reach and engaging the next generation of leaders in our work to pass the For Our Freedom Amendment and create a more representative democracy.

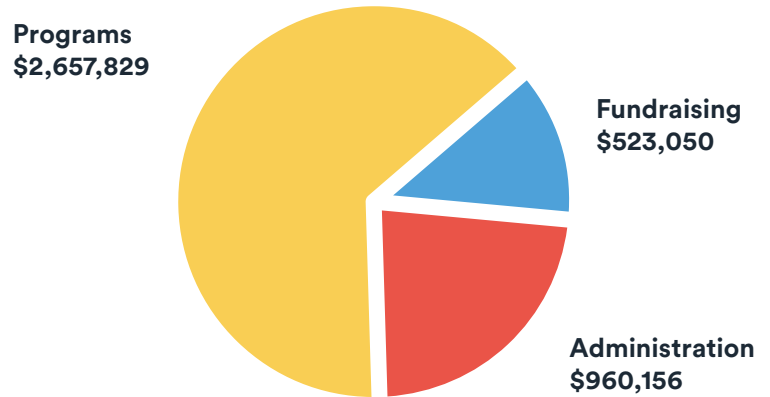

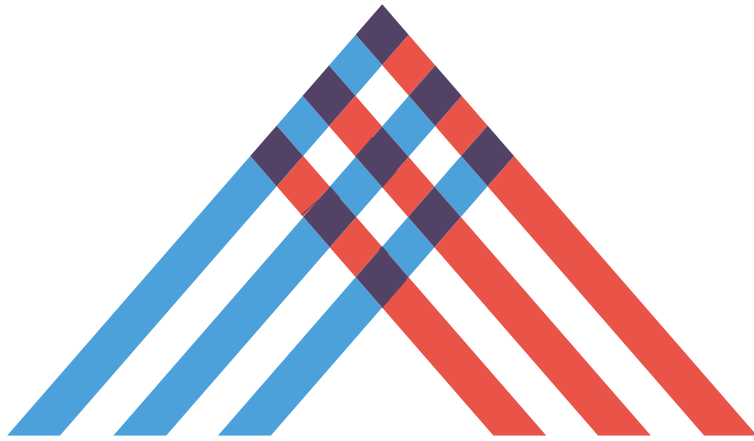
